The Sins of their Father 2 Samuel 13

- I. <u>Uncontrolled lust</u>: David's son Amnon raped David's daughter Tamar (2 Samuel 13:1-19).
 - ✓ Like David, Amnon pursues his lusts.
 - A. Amnon lusted obsessively for Tamar (1-2).
 - B. Cousin Jonadab facilitated Amnon's lust (3-5).
 - Our sinful desires can always find support.
 - A sense of entitlement plus lust is moral danger.
 - C. Amnon raped Tamar (6-14).
 - D. Amnon's lust turned to hatred (15-19).
 - Sinful sexual pleasure never satisfies.
 - All immorality has victims and shame.
- II. <u>Premeditated murder</u>: Absalom murdered Amnon for raping his sister (2 Samuel 13:20-29).
 - ✓ Like David, Absalom orders a murder.
 - A. Absalom gave Tamar refuge but plotted revenge (20)
 - B. David did nothing but get angry (21).
 - Guilt about our own sins can make us passive about addressing sin in our children.
 - C. Absalom executed plot to murder Amnon (22-29).
 - Restrained bitterness masks eventual revenge.
- III. Irrepressible grief: David grieved his losses from his children's sins (2 Samuel 13:30-39).
 - ✓ Like Bathsheba mourned, David mourns his loss.
 - A. David wept thinking all his sons had died (30-31).
 - B. David wept bitterly over Amnon's death (32-37).
 - C. David eventually changed toward Absalom (38-39).
 - Sin always looks like pleasure but ends in grief.
