SERMON OUTLINE

Loyal friends who trust God with you 2 Samuel 15:13-16:14

- I. David's <u>loyal</u> officials: Hearing that Absalom revolted, David decided to flee Jerusalem with many of his friends (15:13-18).
 - True friends are loyal even when you are losing.
 - We can trust God to use setbacks as He delivers us.
- II. Ittai the <u>loyal</u> soldier David offered Ittai freedom to follow Absalom, but Ittai remained loyal (15:19-22).
 - Giving people freedom often prompts loyalty.
 - Godly friends are loyal to those who are loyal to God.
- III. Zadok the <u>loyal</u> priest and spy David told Zadok to stay with God's ark and serve as informant (15:23-29).
 - Worshipping during trials exhibits trust in God's sovereignty.
 - True friends support each other in trusting God
 - True friends courageously accept risk.
- IV. Hushai the <u>loyal</u> advisor and spy David directed Hushai to discreetly undermine Ahithophel (15:30-37).
 - God sends true friends in answer to prayer.
 - Prayer and smart planning are not contradictory.
- V. Ziba the <u>greedy</u> opportunist David innocently believed Ziba and gave him Saul's land (16:1-4).
 - God can provide in trials even from insincere people.
- VI. Shimei the <u>cursing</u> critic David trusted God to handle Shimei's rant and abuse against him (16:5-14).
 - When we trust God's sovereignty we can respond to slander without revenge.
