

Mistaken for a stranger
Luke 24:13-35, p. 858 (Part 6 of 7 – Luke 22-24)

I. JESUS APPEARED INCOGNITO TO CLEOPAS AND A COMPANION ON THE EMMAUS ROAD (LUKE 24:13-24).

- A. Jesus listened to their views of Him (13-24).
 - They considered Jesus to be a powerful prophet of God.
 - They hoped Jesus would deliver Israel nationally and blamed the Jewish leaders for unjustly killing Him.
- B. They told the “stranger” the report of the women who said Jesus was alive (22-24).

II. JESUS EXPLAINED TO THEM THE SCRIPTURES ABOUT THE PROMISED MESSIAH (LUKE 24:25-27).

- A. The Christ (Messiah) must suffer and die and then rise before He would be glorified eternally (25-26, Isaiah 52/53 etc.).
- B. God had revealed through Moses and the prophets Jesus’ real purpose of coming to earth (27 – as the sacrifice for sin).

III. JESUS REVEALED HIMSELF TO THEM WHEN THEY SAT DOWN TO EAT (LUKE 24:28-35).

- A. Invited to stay at their home, Jesus broke bread and allowed them to recognize it was Him (28-32).
- B. Cleopas and his companion hurried to tell Jesus’ disciples and others with them that Jesus was alive (33-35).
