SERMON OUTLINE

Chosen to Serve 1 Samuel 16

- I. God chose David to replace King Saul (16:1-13).
 - A. God sent Samuel to anoint a son of Jesse to replace Saul as king (1-5).
 - God can replace us when we are disqualified.
 - B. God chose young David as king and not his more impressive brothers (6-13).
 - God calls us to serve based on our internal attitudes, not outward appearances.
 - God often calls us to serve when we are young.
 - God empowers those who want to serve Him.
- II. Saul chose David to join his court (16:14-23).
 - A. God used an evil spirit to torment Saul, so his servants suggested he find a harpist to sooth him (14-17).
 - God can use all means, including Satan, to serve His purposes.
 - B. Saul chose David for his musical abilities as well as his courage, speaking, good looks and spiritual life (18-20).
 - God can use all the external gifts he gives us when we are internally committed to Him.
 - C. Saul took David to serve in his court (21-23).
 - Start serving God faithfully in small ways.
 - Glorify God by pleasing your boss no matter what kind of person he/she is.
