SERMON OUTLINE

Overcoming the Power of Jealousy 1 Samuel 19

- I. *There is no jealousy when we focus on what God is doing:* Jonathan befriends David (17:55-18:4).
 - A. Saul takes note of David's family (17:55-58).
 - B. Jonathan promises David his friendship in spite of David's rising status (18:1-4).
- II. Jealousy triggers dangerous emotions when we seek our significance outside of God: Saul attempts to kill David (18:5-16).
 - A. The nation adored David more than Saul causing Saul to be bitterly jealous (5-9).
 - B. Saul's jealousy provoked him to attack David twice with a spear (10-11).
 - C. Saul was afraid because God was with David now instead and also gained popularity (12-16)
- III. Jealousy only gets worse when it's not addressed: Saul gives his daughter to David in an attempt to kill him (18: 17-30)
 - A. Saul plotted to kill David by sending him into battle as his son-in-law (17-20).
 - B. Saul tried to kill David by requiring him to kill 100 Philistines to marry daughter Michal (21-30).

۲	GOD – Humbly submit to God's authority.
	• He controls all things – so others may have it better.
	 He deserves all praise – so I don't.
۲	ME – Admit, confess and repent of jealousy.
	• It's sin.
۲	ME – Deal with my own insecurity.
	 Always review that my significance is God's love for me
	 Thankfully review that all I have is by God's grace
۲	OTHERS – See people like God does
	 Praise God for the successes of others.
	• Affirm/encourage those with the success you long for.
