## **SERMON OUTLINE**

## The Attitude of Encouragement Acts 19:23-20:12

\*Encouragement is the attitude of trusting God's good plan.

- I. <u>Riots and Rejection</u>: Paul had many reasons for discouragement in Ephesus (Acts 19:21-41).
  - A. Constantly changing plans (Acts 19:21-22; 2 Corinthians 1:15-19)
  - B. Many discouragements dealing with problems in Corinth while in Ephesus [1 & 2 Corinthians]
  - C. The Riot in Ephesus (Acts 19:23-41
    - 1. Demetrius organizes opposition (23-27).
    - 2. Riot against Paul lasts for hours (28-34).
    - 3. City clerk calms riot (35-41)
- II. <u>Problems and Plots</u>: Paul encouraged believers in Ephesus and all the churches on the way to Corinth (Acts 20:1-6; 2 Corinthians 1:3-11).
  - A. Paul encouraged believers in Ephesus and all the church on his way to Corinth (Acts 20:1-3a).
  - B. Paul changed his plans again because of a plot to kill him in Corinth (Acts 20:3b-6)

## **Keys to Encouragement**

- 1. Recognize that God alone is our Ultimate Encourager (2 Cor. 1:3-4a; 2 Cor. 7:6-7).
- 2. Recognize God encourages us in our hard times so we can encourage others in theirs (2 Cor. 1:4b-7; Acts 20:1-3).
- 3. Recognize difficulties teach us to trust God, and appreciate when God answers prayer (2 Cor. 1:8-11).
- 4. Seek and accept God's encouragement through other believers (2 Cor. 7:6-7; Acts 19:22, 29; 20:4-6).
- 5. Appreciate God's sovereignty in all that seem to go "wrong" (1 & 2 Corinthians and Romans written!)
