SERMON OUTLINE

Influences and accountability 1 Kings 13 & 14

- I. The prophet of Judah and the prophet of Bethel Accountable for believing lies contrary to God's word (1 Kings 13:1-31)
 - A. The split altar, the shriveled and healed hand were warnings of God's judgment on Jeroboam (13:1-6).
 - B. The prophet from Judah resisted temptation to disobey God by eating with king Jeroboam (13:7-10).
 - C. The old prophet of Bethel lied to him, but God judged the prophet of Judah who disobeyed by eating in Bethel (13:11-31).
 - 1. We are deeply influenced by our greatest fears (Fear of Jeroboam?).
 - 2. We are deeply influenced by our trusted peers (The Judah prophet deceived by a fellow prophet).
 - 3. God holds us accountable for full obedience even we are deceived by other Christians.
- II. Ahijah the prophet Faithfully speaking God's word of judgment to Jeroboam (1 Kings 14)
 - When Jeroboam sent his wife to inquire about their sick son, Ahijah declared God's judgment (14:1-18).
 - 1. God honors those who are courageously faithful to his word by using them throughout their lives.
 - 2. If God addresses our disobedience, how much more will he judge the world (Provers 11:31; 1 Peter 4:17-18)
