SERMON OUTLINE

God's Severe Mercy 2 Samuel 24

- I. Sin and true repentance David counted his army out of pride (2 Samuel 24:1-10).
 - A. God disciplined Israel through David's sin (1-2).
 - B. Though warned by Joab David counted the army (3-9).
 - C. David repented of his sin (10).
- II. Severe consequences David repented, but God still judged his sin (2 Samuel 24:11-16).
 - A. God gave David 3 choices of discipline (11-13).
 - B. David chose a 3 day plague that killed 70,000 (14-15).
- III. Return to fellowship God showed mercy when David worshipped (2 Samuel 24:16-25).
 - A. God stopped the angel from destroying Jerusalem (16).
 - B. David prayed for God to judge him, not the people (17).
 - C. David bought the place God spared, worshipped and God stopped the plague (18-25).

What is true repentance (2 Samuel 24:10, 17, 25)?

- Conscience-stricken Responding to God's inner conviction before getting caught
- 2. I have sinned in what I have done Calling it sin without minimizing or defending ourselves
- 3. Greatly Admitting the magnitude of internal sins like pride
- 4. I have done a very foolish thing Humbly admitting we are capable of foolish, irrational sinful acts or attitudes
- 5. *I beg you, take way the guilt* Throwing ourselves upon God's grace to receive forgiveness, not simply to avoid consequences.
- 6. *I am the one who has sinned* (v.17) Focusing on our own guilt even when we could point to the guilt of others.
- 7. David built an altar to the Lord (v. 25) Returning to a life of worship instead of wallowing in guilty self-pity
