Preposterous Grace Matthew 5:38-48

- I. Unreturned Evil Replacing our <u>rights</u> with preposterous grace (Matthew 5:38-42)
 - A. The Law allowed limited retaliation to address personal crimes (38).
 - B. Jesus replaced retaliation with grace (39-42).
 - 1. Accept injustice with exceptional grace (39).
 - Don't retaliate Turn the other cheek
 - Show unusual grace and generosity toward those who take advantage of you (40-42)
 - Giving up the legal right to possessions
 - Giving up time Going the second mile
 - Risking money by loaning willingly.
- II. Unrestricted Love Replacing <u>revenge</u> with preposterous grace (Matthew 5:43-47).
 - A. The Law acknowledged the right of revenge against Israel's national enemies (43).
 - B. Jesus urges us to love our enemies and pray for our persecutors (44-47).
 - 1. Because showing grace toward enemies <u>honors God by imitating Him</u> (45).
 - 1. Because <u>God rewards</u> those who don't limit love to just friends (46).
 - 2. Because we are identifiable as followers of Christ as we show exceptional grace (47).
- III. Unimaginable Grace Replacing <u>safe spiritual goals</u> with the goal of holiness (Matthew 5:48).
