SERMON OUTLINE

Jesus is Savior and Lord!

Acts 2:14-36 (Peter's sermon part 1)

- I. We can't ignore the power of the Holy Spirit (Acts 2:14-21).
 - A. God did <u>something new:</u> The coming of the Spirit was prophesied by Joel as the beginning of the last days (2:14-16).
 - B. God always <u>saves by grace</u>: Scripture foretold the Holy Spirit, judgment and salvation (2:17-21; Joel 2:28-32).

Point: The coming of the Holy Spirit and salvation through Christ has always been God's eternal plan.

- II. We can't ignore the <u>resurrection of Jesus Christ</u> (Acts 2:22-36).
 - A. Jesus died and rose from the dead as Savior (2:22-32).
 - 1. Jesus did miracles with divine power (22).
 - 2. Jesus was crucified by the Jews and Romans, but according to God's deliberate plan (23).
 - Did Jesus really die because of my sin?
 - 3. Jesus rose from the dead in accordance with David's prophecy (Psalm 16:8-11) and was seen by many eyewitnesses (2:24-32).
 - What difference does it make to me if God really raised Jesus from the dead?
 - B. Jesus ascended to heaven as Lord (2:33-35).
 - 1. The signs of the Spirit verified that Jesus was exalted in heaven (33).
 - 2. David's prophecy of exaltation was about Jesus, not David (34-35; Psalm 110:1)
 - C. Conclusion: Therefore, Jesus who they crucified was their Messiah and Lord (36)!
 - What if Jesus has all authority over me today?
