Grace-motivated living

Matthew 11:28-30; 2 Corinthians 5:14-15, 17 – Core value #4 p. 792; p. 937

I. JESUS CALLS US TO A GRACE-BASED RELATIONSHIP WITH HIM (MATTHEW 11:28-30).

- A. <u>Come to me</u> Jesus invites those burdened by religious guilt and fear into a relationship with Him instead (11:28).
 - o Weary and burdened Performance-based religion brings guilt and fear.
 - o Rest Christ offers joy and freedom of full acceptance.
- B. <u>Take my yoke</u> Jesus invites us to learn to follow Him with the joy of His grace and power (11:29-30).
 - o Yoke of learning We learn submission to Christ.
 - o Gentle/lowly Christ is gracious and patient.
 - o Rest for your souls The obedient enjoy peace.
 - o Easy/light Obeying Christ is not burdensome because we love Him and have the Holy Spirit.

II. JESUS' SACRIFICE DRAWS US TO GRACE-MOTIVATED SERVICE FOR HIM (2 CORINTHIANS 5:14-15).

- A. <u>Compelled by love</u>: Christ's love for us draws us to live selflessly for Him (2 Corinthians 5:14a).
- B. <u>He died/we died</u> We died with Christ so we are no longer who we were before we were saved (5:14b, 5:17).
- C. <u>He lives/we live</u> Grace motivates us to live for Him who was raised for us, not for ourselves (5:15).

Core Value #4 – Grace – We seek to worship and obey the Lord motivated by gratitude for God's undeserved kindness to us through Jesus Christ.
