SERMON OUTLINE

When God Says No 2 Samuel 7:1-17

- I. When God says No David desired to <u>build a house for God</u>, but that wasn't God's priority (2 Samuel 7:1-11a).
 - A. David wanted to build a permanent temple to house the ark, just as David had a permanent house (7:1-3).
 - B. God said David should <u>not</u> build the temple for God, but God did want to bless David and Israel (7:4-11a).
 - 1. God's priority was not a physical building but spiritual worship (4-7).
 - 2. God's priority was to bless David (8-9).
 - 3. God's priority was to bless Israel with a land and with peace (10-11a).
 - C. God told David not to build the temple because of his wars (1 Chron. 28:2-3; I Kings 5:3).
 - When God says no to my plans, He has a different and better purpose for me.
- II. God says Yes to something better God desired to <u>build a house for David</u> because that was God's priority (2 Samuel 7:11b-17).
 - A. <u>House</u> David's descendants will forever survive and Solomon will build the temple (7:11b-13a).
 - B. <u>Throne</u> David's descendants will forever rule –Israel will be disciplined but always loved by God (7:14-15).
 - C. <u>Kingdom</u> David's descendants will forever be a nation Jesus will rule in the Millennium and forever (7:16; Luke 1:31-33; Matthew 19:28; Acts 15:14-16).
 - When God says no to my plans, He wants to bless me long term, not just immediately.
