SERMON OUTLINE

Opposite Attitudes toward God 1 Samuel 2:12-36

- I. <u>It starts with Attitude</u>: Our attitude toward God determines God's attitude toward us (1 Samuel 2:12-21).
 - A. Greed: Eli's sons demanded for themselves offerings intended for God (12-17).
 - B. <u>Service</u>: Hannah's son Samuel served the Lord and God blessed her with many children (18-21).
- II. <u>Our Attitude becomes our Reputation</u>: Our reputation among others reflects our attitude toward God (1 Samuel 2:22-26).
 - A. <u>Immorality</u>: Word spread that Hophni and Phinehas slept with women at the tabernacle (22-24).
 - B. <u>Refusing correction</u>: Hophni and Phinehas ignored their dad's warnings about sinning against God (25).
 - C. Obedience: Samuel earned God's favor and the respect of the people (26).
- III. <u>Our Attitude has Outcomes</u>: God honors those who honor him, but dishonors those who dishonor Him (1 Samuel 2:27-36).
 - A. A prophet rebuked Eli for his family abusing their spiritual privileges (27-29).
 - B. The prophet declares Eli's male descendant will die young (30-33).
 - God treats us according to our attitude whether or not we honor him.
 - C. The prophet declared that Eli's sons would die the same day and God would replace Eli's family as priests (34-36; 1 Kings 2:26-35).
