Following Christ when it's Hard


I. Questions of the disciples that prompted Jesus' prophetic discussion (Mark 13:1-4)

- A. A disciple commented to Jesus about the amazing temple Herod was building (13:1).
- B. Jesus prophesied that the temple will be destroyed (13:2).
 - The temple Herod built was destroyed in AD 70 by the Romans, just 4 years after the 80+ required to build it.
 - <u>Principle</u>: God is not impressed by buildings and does not need them, though He may use them.
- C. The disciples ask Jesus <u>when</u> this would happen and <u>what signs</u> would precede it (13:3-4).

II. <u>Warnings and Wisdom for believers in all ages</u> in light of God's future plan (Mark 13:5-13)

- Note: The "abomination of desolation" (Mark 13:14) occurs half-way through the 7-year Tribulation (Daniel 9:27; 11:31).
- <u>Note</u>: Some Bible prophecies have double fulfillments an event in one age, plus an ultimate fulfillment in a later age.
- Mark 13:5-13 occur <u>immediately</u> to the disciples and <u>ultimately</u> in the 7 year Tribulation, but also <u>generally</u> today.
- A. Be alert to deception by false Messiahs. (13:5-8).
 - 1. Don't be fooled by those claiming to be the Messiah (5-6).
 - 2. Don't assume the end is here just because there are wars and rumors of wars, earthquakes and famines (7-8).
 - Principle: God uses wars, natural disasters in His plan.
- B. Be ready to face persecution by God's enemies (13:9-13).
 - 1. Followers of Christ are persecuted (9; John 16:32-17:9).
 - 2. The gospel will go to many nations (10; Matthew 28:18-20).
 - 3. God gives wisdom when believers must speak for Him (11).
 - 4. Believers may even be opposed by their families (12-13).
