When God Seems Too Late Mark 5:21-24; 35-43

I. <u>Jairus' Desperate Faith</u>: Desperate times call for desperate prayer (Mark 5:21-24).

- A. Jesus returns to Capernaum (22).
- B. Jairus, who had heard and seen Jesus heal previously, asks Jesus for a miracle (23-24).
 - ✓ God uses personal pain and need to build our faith. We pray deeply when we care deeply.
 - \checkmark When we get desperate enough we are open to believing in the power of God.

[Woman healed of bleeding – Next week's study (5:25-34)]

II. <u>Jairus' Lost Cause and Jesus' Assurance</u>: Don't fear, just trust (Mark 5:35-36).

- A. The assumption of Jairus' friends: Don't bother Jesus because your daughter has died: (35).
 - \checkmark Don't limit God based on assumptions and "if only's."
- B. The assurance of Jesus: Don't be afraid; just believe (36).
 - ✓ God asks us to trust Him when our hope is gone so that our focus is on His control and so we let go of ours.

III. <u>Jesus raises the girl from the dead:</u> Never underestimate the power of God (Mark 5:37-43).

- A. Traumatic Grieving: Jesus rebukes their loud display of grief (37-40).
 - ✓ We can misuse trials to gain personal attention.
- B. Tender Resurrection: Total, instantaneous health (41-43).
 - ✓ God can accomplish amazing things in all situations (Ephesians 3:20-21). There are no lost causes!
 - ✓ Late timing for us can be perfect timing for God.

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
