## As for me and my House

Joshua and Judges

- I. The Story of 3 generations <u>Joshua</u>, the <u>elders</u> and their <u>children</u> (Joshua 24: 14-31; Judges 2:6-13).
- II. The Three chairs Issues of Spiritual Legacy
  - A. <u>1<sup>st</sup> Chair</u> Knows God personally and serve him single-heartedly (Joshua 24:14-27).
    - <u>Relationship</u> A deep personal reverence for God and avoids ungodly influences (Joshua 24:14).
    - A passion for influencing children and others to serve God wholeheartedly (Joshua 24:15; 4:5-7).
    - Finds, follows and serves alongside godly mentors (Exodus 24:13; Numbers 11:28)
    - Personally knows God's Word and commits to obeying it whether others do or not (Joshua 1:8-9; 24:15).
    - Experiences the power of God firsthand by trusting God and obeying in difficult tests (Joshua 3:5, 13-15).
  - B. <u>2<sup>nd</sup> Chair</u>— Knows about God, but doesn't model that commitment or communicate it (Judges 2:6-7).
    - <u>Religion</u> Intends to follow God (Joshua 24:16-18, 21), but only does minimum externals (Judges 11:31; 20:27)
    - Incomplete obedience Knows God's word, but doesn't trust God enough to obey (Deut. 7:1-2; Judges 1:19-35)
    - Reliance on others Only obeys God when others hold them accountable (Joshua and the judges).
  - C. **3<sup>rd</sup> Chair** Doesn't know God personally (Judges 2:8-13)
    - Rejection Ignores God's authority and salvation unless in trouble
- III. A Sincere Faith passed on Joshua 24:15; 2 Timothy 1:5.
