Fellowship and Betrayal

Mark 14:12-21

- I. <u>Fellowship</u>: Jesus and His disciples prepared and ate the Passover (Mark 14:12-16).
 - A. <u>Preparation of the Meal</u>: Peter and John contact the owner of the home and prepare the meal.
 - Principle: Jesus Christ deeply desires our fellowship (Luke 22:15-16; John 17).
 - <u>Principle</u>: Christ wants our fellowship in spite of our failures.
 - B. <u>Theme of the Meal</u>: As the disciples argue about greatness, Jesus demonstrated <u>servanthood</u> by washing their feet (Luke 22:24-30; John 13:1-20)
 - <u>Principle</u>: Humility is the core qualification for anyone who wants to serve Christ. *How do I desire personal significance instead of God's glory in my service?*
- II. <u>Betrayal</u>: Jesus declared that one disciple would betray Him (Mark 14:17-21; John 13:2, 21-30).
 - A. <u>Prediction</u>: Jesus stated that one of the disciples would betray Him, which troubled them greatly (14:17-20).
 - Principle: No ministry effort is without personal or relational trouble (Jesus and Judas).
 - <u>Principle</u>: Unaddressed selfish motives can turn a follower of Christ into a betrayer of Christ. What could turn me from following/obeying Christ?
 - B. <u>Pronouncement</u>: Jesus said the betrayer could not stop God's plan, but would face terrible consequences (14:21).
 - Principle: Satanic opposition cannot spoil Christ's plan.
 - Principle: Those who oppose God are judged by God.
