The Seriousness of Not Loving 1 John 3:11-15

- I. Believers must love one another (1 John 3: 11-12).
 - A. <u>Jesus' Command</u>: We must love one another as Christ commanded (3:11; John 13:34).
 - B. Cain Example of hating brother: Don't be like Cain who hated his brother (3:12).
 - His brother Someone who was once close could become someone we now hate.
 - His own actions were evil <u>Guilt</u> about ourselves is often transferred into a hatred for someone else.
 - His brother's (actions) were righteous <u>Envy</u> of someone else is often the source of our hatred.
 - C. <u>World Example of unbeliever's hatred</u>: Don't be surprised that the world hates believers [implied but believers shouldn't hate their own.] (3:13).
- II. Believers expose their spiritual condition by loving or failing to love fellow believers (1 John 3:13-14).
 - A. <u>Love</u>: When we love our fellow believers our new life is obvious (3:14a; see John 13:35).
 - B. <u>Hate</u>: When we do not love our fellow believers our old nature is obvious (3:14b-15).
 - We are "abiding in" death our old sinful nature (3:14b).
 - To hate our brother is spiritually like murder; the new nature is not "abiding in" one who murders (3:15).
