Spiritual Purity: The Goal of God's Justice

Joshua 11:16-23 (Summary of the Conquest of Canaan)

I. <u>God's Justice</u>: God "hardened the hearts" of the Canaanites and Amorites, yet punished their sin because of their guilt (Joshua 11:20).

Hearts Hardened by God and by Choice

- 1. Pharaoh's heart was hardened by God, yet he hardened his own heart (Exodus 4:21; 8:15,32; 9:7,12; 10:1,20,27).
- 2. Today in all cultures God "gives people over" to sin who choose to suppress the truth about God (Romans 1:18-24).
- 3. In the Tribulation, those who *refuse to believe* the truth will be *given a delusion* by God (2 Thessalonians 2:9-12).
- A. God was just to punish the Canaanites.
 - They accumulated sin over generations (Genesis 15:16).
 - They were judged for their immorality (Leviticus 18:24-28).
 - God still judges sexual immorality (Hebrews 13:4).
- B. A holy and just God is always holy and just when He punishes sin (Isaiah 6:3; Deuteronomy 32:4; Romans 2:2).
- II. <u>Our Purity</u>: God destroyed the Canaanites because He cared about their spiritual purity.
 - A. <u>Purity of Influence</u>: God wanted to keep Israel from intermarrying with Canaanites (Deuteronomy 7:1-4).
 - The person we marry and our closest friends will influence us either toward God or sin (2 Corinthians 6:14; Ephesians 5:7,8).
 - B. <u>Purity of Devotion:</u> God wanted Israel to avoid being snared by idolatry (Deuteronomy 7:16; 12:1-4; 20:17-18)
 - We may need drastic changes in our surroundings to develop a holy lifestyle (2 Corinthians 7:1).

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
