The True King and the Weak Judge

- I. <u>The True King</u>: Jesus is the king, but of a different realm (Mark 15:1-5).
 - A. The Sanhedrin sends Jesus to Pilate accusing Him of insurrection (15:1; Luke 23:2).
 - Jesus knew all this would happen (Mark 10:33-34). We know that everything difficult in our life is known by God.
 - B. <u>Jesus answers Pilate</u>, agreeing He is a king, but saying that His kingdom is not of this world (15:2; John 18:33-38).
 - On which kingdom do we focus the temporal or eternal?
 - C. <u>Jesus does not answer the Jews'</u> false accusations (15:3-5).
- II. <u>The Weak Judge</u>: Pilate tries to avoid making a decision, but gives in and condemns Jesus (Mark 15:6-15).

(Pilate sends Jesus to Herod who gives no verdict Luke 23:5-12)

- A. <u>Pilate's Dilemma</u>: Pilate asks if they want Jesus or Barabbas released and they ask for Barabbas (15:6-11).
 - Satan uses the intentional evil of a few to influence the unsuspecting many.
- B. <u>Pilate's Decision</u>: Pilate condemns Jesus to death giving in the pressure of the people and chief priests (15:15).

Pilate: Reluctant but Weak

- Pilate knows the Jews condemned Jesus because of envy (15:10).
- Pilate knows Jesus wasn't quilty of subverting Rome (Luke 23:2-5).
- Pilate's wife advises him to not condemn Jesus (Matthew 27:19).
- Pilate fears that Jesus is the Son of God (John 9:7-12).
- Yet, Pilate gives in, "washing his hands" of Jesus' fate, but condemning Jesus to death because He is afraid of the Jews (15:5).
 - "Reluctant sin" is still sin. Our "reluctance" reveals that we thought it over and decided to do it anyway.
 - Crucial spiritual decisions are determined either by our "fear of God" or our fear of people.

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
