The Sin of Quitting Joshua 12-13, 16-19

What God promises: God provides us power if we follow through (Joshua 12-13).

I.

- A. <u>Past Power</u>: God had already cleared out 31 (33) kings for Israel to occupy their land (Joshua 12).
- B. <u>Present Power</u>: God promised to drive out remaining Canaanites as each tribe pursued them (Joshua 13).
 - 1. Each tribe was to finish the job of conquering and occupying their allotted land (13:1-7—Inheritance of the two and a half tribes east of Jordan 13:8-32)
 - 2. Caleb from the tribe of Judah finished taking his land [Joshua 14:6-15:63 previous study].
 - ✓ God is seeking to engage His power in what we are asked to do.
 - ✓ To accomplish things for God we must trust God and obediently follow through.
- II. Why we fail to finish: Any excuse for not following through is disobedience (Joshua 15-19; James 4:17).
 - ✓ Many tribes failed to drive out the Canaanites (Joshua 15:63; 16:10; 17:12-16; 19:47).
 - A. **Money**: Some tribes forced the Canaanites to work for them instead of driving them out (Joshua 16:10; 17:12-13; Judges 1:34-35).
 - B. **Laziness/Difficulty:** Some wanted more land but did not want to <u>clear the timber</u> where the Perizzites lived in the hills and complained about the <u>iron chariots</u> of the Canaanites in the plains (Joshua 17:14-18).
 - C. **Procrastination**: Many tribes <u>delayed</u> pursuing their allotments (Joshua 18:1-10; Judges 1:34; Judges 18:1).
