Hard Hearts

Mark 6:45-56

- I. <u>Spiritual Depth</u> Jesus maintained intimacy with the Father through prolonged prayer (Mark 6:45-46).
 - A. Jesus sent the disciples away (45).
 - B. Jesus spent time praying in the mountain (46).
 - Spiritual intimacy is accomplished only as we spend considerable time alone with God.
- II. <u>Spiritual Dullness</u> The disciples were fearful and amazed at Jesus' power because they had hard hearts (Mark 6:47-56).
 - A. Jesus allowed the disciples struggle to row against a storm on the Sea of Galilee until 3 AM (47-48).
 - God may delay rescuing us from trials until the time is right for what He wants to teach us.
 - B. Jesus walked on water and calmed the wind (49-51).
 - God can overrule natural law anytime He wants.
 - C. The disciples were amazed because they didn't connect Jesus' last miracle with the current fear (52).
 - We can know God's power factually, but forget it when our personal security is threatened.
 - Failure to trust God in trials is a serious sin.

Spiritual Dullness (Hard Hearts in Believers)

- 1. Spiritual dullness happens to believers who have <u>already</u> experienced the power of God significantly.
- 2. Spiritual dullness happens when we <u>fixate on the moment instead of seeing the big picture</u> of God's faithfulness over time.
- 3. Spiritual dullness becomes a <u>prolonged condition</u> unless we embrace a faith attitude, focusing on God's nature instead of our needs.
- D. Jesus continued to heal throughout Galilee (53-56).
 - > God doesn't wait around for the spiritually dull.
