## SERMON OUTLINE

## Faith that Serves (Good works – Part 1) James 2:14-19

I. <u>Main Point</u>: Faith without good works is dead – useless to all (James 2:14-17).

## Do Paul and James disagree?

- PAUL (Ephesians 2:8-9) For it is by grace you have been <u>saved</u>, <u>through faith</u>—and this not from yourselves, <u>it is the gift of God-</u>{9} <u>not by works</u>, so that no one can boast.
- JAMES (James 2:14) What good is it, my brothers, if someone says he has faith but does not have works? Can that faith save him? (James 2:17) So also faith by itself, if it does not have works, is dead.
- No they don't disagree! Hint: (Ephesians 2:10) For we are God's workmanship, <u>created in Christ Jesus to do good works</u>, which God prepared in advance for us to do.
- A. Our faith is useless to ourselves without works (2:14) [It can't "save" us when God evaluates (judges) our lives as believers, James 2:12-13; 1 Corinthians 3:11-15; 2 Corinthians 5:10].
- B. Our faith is useless to those in need if we don't serve by helping them (2:15-17).
  - Am I personally helping those who have financial or practical needs? When? How?
- II. Regardless of what anyone says, good works matter greatly (James 2:18-19).
  - A. It's a serious spiritual problem when a believer doesn't add good works to their faith (2:18; 2 Peter 1:5-11).
    - No one can show their faith without works.
    - ▶ Do my good works show my faith to unbelievers (Matthew 5:16; John 13:35)?
  - B. Just believing right is useless to those in need; even demons believe right about God (2:19).
    - Am I seeking to know and do the good works has God planned for me?
