God's Unique Plan for Unique Lives

Joshua 20,21

- I. <u>Cities of Refuge</u>: For those who face unique misfortune (Joshua 20; Deuteronomy 19:1-13: Numbers 35:6, 9-34)
 - A. God provided <u>six cities</u> of refuge from injustice for those who accidentally killed someone (Joshua 20:1-3).
 - B. Someone who fled to the cities would be tried and if innocent of hostile intent, he must live in the city of refuge until the high priest died (Joshua 20:4-7).
 - ➤ The "Why?" Question
 - 1. God understands our unique regrets and injustices.
 - 2. God is where we must run in unique difficulties.
 - 3. We don't need to live in fear, regret or resentment when we trust God's sovereignty, love and vindication.
 - 4. Unique trials become either an <u>excuse</u> for bitterness or an <u>opportunity</u> to glorify God (John 9:1-3).
- II. <u>Cities of the Levites</u>: For those who have a unique calling (Joshua 21; Numbers 35:1-6; Deuteronomy 18:1-8)
 - A. The Levites received <u>48 cities</u> to live in throughout Israel (Joshua 21: Numbers 35:1-6).
 - B. The Levites received <u>offerings</u> and <u>tithes</u> to live on (Joshua 13:14; Deuteronomy 18:1; Nehemiah 10:37-39)
 - Paying those in vocational ministry (1 Corinthians 9:9-14; 1 Timothy 5:17-18)
 - C. The Levites experienced the blessing of <u>serving the Lord Himself</u> (Joshua 13:33; Deuteronomy 18:2).
 - ➤ The "Ministry" Question
 - 1. God calls all to ministry some full-time (Acts 13:2).
 - 2. God's unique ministry calling for each of us involves unique <u>sacrifice</u>, but also unique blessing.

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
