Handling Conflict

Joshua 22

I. The Story of Israel's Conflict and Resolution (Joshua 22:1-34)

- A. Exhortation & Blessing: Joshua exhorts the 2 ½ tribes before they go home across the Jordan (1-9).
- B. <u>Misunderstanding</u>: The 2 ½ tribes build an altar at the Jordan seemingly in disobedience (Deuteronomy 12:13,14); so the 9 ½ tribes prepare for war (10-12).
- C. <u>Confrontation/Discussion</u>: A delegation is sent to confront and mediate the potential conflict (13-20).
- D. Explanation: The 2 ½ tribes explain that their altar was not intended as a rival, but as a reminder that they were part of Israel (21-29).
- E. <u>Resolution</u>: The explanation is accepted and forgiveness granted (30-34).

II. Lessons about Conflict Resolution

- A. Real misunderstandings do happen because we cannot see or judge motives.
- B. Some conflicts are avoidable.
 - 1. More wisdom "What might this cause?"
 - 2. Better communication "Who should know this or have input?"
 - 3. Really <u>listening</u> "Do I really know what they are/were thinking or feeling?"
- C. Get help when you need help (Mediation)
- D. Realize sin exists on both sides. Admit your own.
- E. Forgive and let it go like Christ (Ephesians 4:32).
 - The importance of Grace, Truth and Time
