Christ Lives in Me

Galatians 2:11-21

- I. <u>Living to please people</u> We can fall into the trap of trying to please others based on non-biblical *external* behavior (Galatians 2:11-14).
 - A. Paul confronted Peter for giving in to the pressure of some Jews about avoiding gentile Christians (2:11-13).
 - B. Peter hypocritically communicated that "good" Christians must conform to non-biblical expectations of others (2:14).
- II. <u>Living by faith to please God</u> The life of spiritual freedom comes as we depend on Christ for *internal* power to please God (Galatians 2:15-16; 19-20).
 - A. We are <u>saved</u> by faith in Christ, not works depending upon Christ to save us (2:15-16).
 - B. We must learn to <u>grow</u> by faith in Christ, not works depending on Christ's power to transform us from within because he lives in us (2:19-20).
 - As a believer, I am no longer condemned for my sin for one reason...That I might <u>live for God</u> (2:19)

How We Grow Spiritually (Galatians 2:20)

- 1. *Crucified with Christ* We must realize as believers that in our new status we are no longer under sin's *penalty* or *power* (Romans 6:6).
- 2. No longer I...Christ lives in me We can grow in true righteousness from within because God's life has been imparted to us (Galatians 6:15; 2 Corinthians 5:17).
- 3. The life I live... I live by faith in the Son of God We learn to discern and do what is right by continually depending on Christ's indwelling power (not by responding to false guilt or the expectations of others).

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
