Being the Parent

Various Proverbs

- Review Foundational Parenting issue God's first goal is to shape me as I parent. Then God can help me shape my child.
- Main Point: A parent must teach to give wisdom and discipline to enforce and shape character.

I. Teach to give wisdom

- A. Teaching and Listening God intends children to learn from their parents wisdom (1:8; 4:1; 5:1; 6:20; Deuteronomy 6: 1-9).
- B. Submitting God intends children to obey their parents (8:32; 15:5, 31; 16:20; 19:16, 27; 5:11-13; Ephesians 6:1-4).

II. Discipline to enforce and shape character

- A. Why: The Purposes of Discipline
 - So that you can enjoy your children (10:1; 23:15, 25; 29:17)
 - To spare the child consequences (19:18; 15:10; 29:1; 23:14)
- B. Why and How: The Atmosphere of Discipline: Love
 - Love (3:11-12: 13:23)
 - Not retaliation (29:22; 24:29; Colossians 3:21)
 - Self-Controlled (15:1; 29:11)
- C. How: The Process of Discipline
 - <u>Verbal discipline</u> Instructions are the first and major method of discipline. If a child responds to rebuke, no further discipline is needed (13:13).
 - <u>Natural or logical consequences</u> When verbal instructions are not followed, natural or logical consequences follow (10:8; 15:5; 29:1).
 - <u>Corporal Punishment</u> When younger children defy and resist other forms of correction, obedience must be carefully and lovingly enforced (13:24; 20:30; 29:15, 17).

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
