Pursuing True Greatness Mark 9:33-37

- I. The Tempting Quest for Personal Greatness (Mark 9:33-34).
 - A. Jesus confronts the disciples who were arguing about which of them was the greatest (33).
 - B. The disciples try to hide their pursuit of greatness (34).
 - Our natural bent toward comparing and ranking ourselves reveals our selfish quest for greatness.
- II. The Humbling Path to True Greatness (Mark 9:35-37)
 - A. Jesus sits down to teach the disciples that those who want to be first must be last and must be servants of all (35).
 - We can be released from our quest for greatness only by shifting our focus to just pleasing God.
 - Greatness in God's eyes is measured by service.
