Following Christ and Leading People to Him Mark 2:13-17

I. <u>Following Christ – A decision for discipleship</u>: Am I following Christ wholeheartedly (Mark 2:13-14)?

- A. <u>The Privilege of following Christ</u>: God often picks the least likely to follow Him the most closely.
 - As a despised tax-collector, Levi (Matthew) was a surprising pick to follow Christ as a disciple.
 - Have I decided that God mostly uses just certain kind of people?
- B. <u>The Sacrifice of following Christ</u>: Following Christ is always costly affecting our purpose and priorities.
 - Levi left a profitable livelihood to follow Christ.
 - > How does my desire for money or material things affect my willingness to serve God?

II. <u>Leading people to Christ – The Process of Evangelism</u>: Am I reaching out relationally to those who need Christ (Mark 2:15-17)?

A. <u>Christ's Method of Outreach</u>: To lead people to Christ we must have normal, meaningful relationships with people who are unsaved.

- Have I distanced myself from unbelievers because I am most comfortable with believers as friends?
- If my unsaved friends are not open to Christ right now, will I still love them or will I reject them as friends?
- Who am I targeting to introduce to Jesus Christ? How will I do it?
- B. <u>Christ's Focus of Outreach</u>: To lead people to Christ, we must seek out those who know they have a spiritual need (2:16, 17).
 - It is the spiritually needy, not the self-righteous who respond to the gospel of Jesus Christ.
