## The New Way of Grace Mark 2:18-22

- I. <u>Fasting The problem of Legalistic Traditions:</u> Defining spirituality by what we <u>don't do</u> (Mark 2:18-20).
  - A. The Fasting Issue of Jewish culture: Jesus didn't conform to the regular "godly" fasting (2 times/week 2:18).
    - Spirituality is not defined by what we don't do.
  - B. The Fasting Answer of Jesus: Jesus said you don't mourn when the bridegroom is present (2:19-20).
    - Spirituality is better defined as "enjoying the presence of Christ."

Living by Grace or Legalism?  1. Legalistic Obedience: I don't think godly Christians should; I don't; Therefore I must be godly.  — And those who do these things must not be as godly as me.
<ul> <li>Grace/Relationship-based Obedience: I love and enjoy fellowship with Christ; prevents or hinders my relationship with Christ; Therefore I choose not to</li> <li>I can't know the closeness of another person's relationship with God. Therefore I will pray for them if I am concerned about their choices and not assume they are less spiritual.</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>II. Patches and Wineskins – Law and Grace don't Mix: Making choices in the new way of grace based on our relationship to God (Mark 2:21-22)</li> <li>A. The Picture of New patches on Old clothes (21)</li> <li>B. The Picture of New wine in Old Wineskins (22)</li> </ul>
