## In Need of Mercy and Faith as we Pray Mark 10:46-52

- I. Our Need for Mercy Blind Bartimaeus asks for healing (Mark 10:46-48).
  - Son of David Bartimaeus knew Jesus was the Messiah. What view of God do our prayers reveal?
  - *He began to shout* Desperate need prompts desperate and bold prayer. Are we honest with God in prayer?
  - *Have mercy on me* Do we see ourselves as deserving God's help? Is confession part of our attitude of prayer?
- II. Our Need for Faith Jesus hears and heals Bartimaeus (Mark 10:49-52a). *Your faith has healed you* What is the role of human faith in prayer?
  - 1. My Faith in the <u>Plan of God</u> Do I trust God's plan about <u>what</u> I am asking His will be done?
  - My <u>Faith</u> in the <u>Power of God</u> Do I trust that God's power is the only <u>way</u> my prayer can be answered?
    - "Faith" is not something I can take credit for, but it is me giving <u>control</u> to God and then <u>credit</u> to God when He answers.
  - *Immediately he received his sight* Do we pray expecting true miracles or do we ask God minimally for "just a boost?"
- III. The Changed Life Bartimaeus Followed Jesus (Mark 10:52b).
  - *Followed Jesus* Does our spiritual commitment reflect real gratitude for God's blessings and answers to prayer?
