## Stewards Not Owners

Part 1 – Biblical Financial Stewardship

# I. God owns everything.

- A. God owns everything because He created everything (Genesis 1:1, 29-30; 2:8-17; 9:3; Psalm 24:1; 50:9-12).
- B. We don't "own" anything because we don't take it with us (Job 1:21; 1 Timothy 6:7; Ecclesiastes 5:15)

# II. We are stewards, not owners.

- A. Stewards manage the property of others and are given greater privilege if they are faithful (Genesis 39:4-6; 41:37-39; 1 Corinthians 4:2).
- B. When we are trustworthy stewards of our finances, God can trust us spiritually as well (Luke 16:10-12).
  - > How much we have does not indicate our spirituality; how we manage what we have does.
  - > Every financial decision is a spiritual decision.

## III. Stewards think different than owners.

- A. <u>Stewards realize work is a gift</u> God enables us to earn the money we have (Deuteronomy 8:17-18; 1 Chronicles 29:12).
- B. <u>Stewards are grateful and content</u> We are stewards when we are grateful about what we have and content about what we don't have (Philippians 4:12,18).
- C. <u>Stewards give willingly</u> God asks for a "tithe" so we can express that He owns it all and that we trust Him to provide our needs (Malachi 3:10).
- D. <u>Stewards can enjoy blessings</u> God enables us to have many good things to enjoy. (1 Timothy 6:17).
