## Gideon: Compromise in Victory Judges 8

## I. Gideon completed the victory (Judges 8:1-21).

- A. Gideon wisely handled Ephraim's petty jealousy (8:1-3).
  - Pride, Jealousy Do we get upset when we aren't invited to help or don't get credit for success?
  - ➤ Giving a wise and "soft answer" Do we know how to respond wisely to angry people (Proverbs 15:1)?
- B. Gideon punished those who refused to help and even hindered his men (8:5-17).
  - > Do we ever hinder someone from serving God because of fear, envy etc.? Do we hesitate to serve God if we are unsure how it will turn out?
- C. Gideon pursued the Midianites to their end (8:4; 18-21).
  - Persistence Do we finish what we start?

## II. Gideon compromised <u>after</u> victory (Judges 8:22-35).

- A. Gideon rightly refused the kingship and declared that God alone must rule the people (8:22-23).
- B. Gideon wrongly established a "priesthood" which distracted the people from worshipping God (8:24-27).
  - Wisdom failure: Gideon unwisely made an ephod, which gave everyone an excuse for idolatry.
  - Character failure: Gideon usurped God's priesthood by making an ephod.
- C. Gideon led Israel as judge for 40 years of peace until he died (8:28-35).
  - Character failure: Gideon seemed to adopt the lifestyle of a king though refusing the title

     wealth, women (Deut. 17:17)
  - Consequence of compromise: Gideon's positive impact ended when he died.

<u>Main Point</u>: Do we rest on spiritual victories in our past without paying attention to dangerous compromises with temptation now?

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
