## What Angers God

Mark 11:12-18

- I. Jesus Curses the Fig Tree: <u>Claiming godliness without the fruit of godliness</u> (Mark 11:12-14)
  - A. Story: Jesus cursed the fig tree that had no edible fruit.
  - B. <u>Point</u>: Jesus was condemning the Jewish leaders for their religious performance, but lack of real spiritual fruit (see Luke 13:6-7). The fig tree pictures what Jesus would confront when He got to the temple that day.
    - God always confronts hypocrisy (Jeremiah 3:5; 3:10; 12:2; 1 Samuel 15:22) and desires sincerity (Psalm 51:16-17).
- II. Jesus Clears the Temple: <u>Pursuing what profits me instead of what</u> pleases God (Mark 11:15-18)
  - A. <u>Story</u>: Jesus drove out the businessmen and money changers who set up shop in the Gentile court to make money for themselves and Jewish leaders.
  - B. <u>Point</u>: Jesus was confronting those who replaced worship with their own selfish interests.
    - Racial Pride and Prejudice The merchant area of the temple was the court of the gentiles which was to be "a house of prayer for *all nations*."

Do I have a spiritually exclusive or proud view of myself?

 <u>Financial Greed and Selfishness</u> – The financial operation at the temple revealed greedy hearts.

Does financial greed or fear consume me and impede my worship?

• Failure to Worship – The core problem at the temple was that worship was absent or hindered for most.

God's ultimate purpose in my life is my worship. How is it going?
