Taxes, Government and Pleasing God

Mark 12:13-17

- I. Question: Is it right to pay taxes even to an unjust government (Mark 12:13-15a).
 - A. The Pharisees and Herodians question Jesus (12:13).
 - They were sent by others (the Sanhedrin?)
 - They flattered Jesus pretending to respect Him.
 - B. They asked Jesus if it is right to pay taxes to Caesar or not (12:14b-15a).
 - They tried to trap Jesus into either opposing Caesar by saying no, or angering most people by saying yes.
- II. <u>Answer</u>: Yes, we must submit to human authority and to God's authority (Mark 12:15b-17)
 - A. Jesus asked for a coin used for paying taxes (15b).
 - B. Jesus said that people should give to Caesar what he asks and to God what He asks (16-17)

Principles of Submission to Government

- 1. We must <u>submit to government</u> even paying taxes we don't like (Romans 13:1-7; 1 Peter 2:13-17).
- 2. We must <u>obey God instead of man</u> if a governmental decree violates God's decree (Acts 4:17-20; 5:18-29).
- 3. We can sometimes <u>participate in government</u> as believers (Joseph, Daniel, Voting for biblical values and running for office in a democracy).
- 4. We must <u>pray for those in power</u> that we can live quiet and peaceful, godly, holy life. (1 Timothy 2:1-5)

Principles of Submission to God

- 1. Live guiet, peaceful, godly and holy (1Timothy 2:1-2).
- 2. Preach the gospel regardless of government (1Timothy 2:3-7) remembering that Christ is with us always (Matthew 28:18-20).
