Teaching children how to relate to God Ephesians 6:4

- I. <u>Beware</u> of discouraging your child as you relate to him or her (Ephesians 6:4a).
 - Dads (and moms) must realize how their way of relating can have a negative impact on their children.
 - Exasperate/provoke to anger Parents can be partly responsible for their child's attitude.
 - Embitter/provoke (Colossians 3:21) Parents can be responsible for disheartening children

A Parent's Authority

- 1. <u>Authoritative</u> Firm, gentle leadership motivated by love, godliness, grace and humility
- 2. <u>Authoritarian</u> Harsh, unbending control motivated by anger and pride
- II. <u>Train</u> your child how to relate to God (Ephesians 6:4b).
 - Dads (and moms) must realize the positive impact they can have by teaching children how to relate to God.
 - > Bring them up Feed, nourish your child spiritually.
 - Training Teach them what God says to do.
 - > Instruction Warn them of what God says to avoid.
