## Samson: Ability without Maturity Judges 14, 15:1-8

- I. Romance based on emotions: Samson wants a wife who is not godly (14:1-4)
  - ➤ The immature are controlled romantically by beauty and emotions instead of godliness (Proverbs 31:30).
- II. Ignoring spiritual commitments: Samson violates his Nazirite vow (14:5-9)
  - The immature flippantly ignore spiritual commitments they've made to God (James 4:17).
- III. Trying to prove we're something: Samson wagers foolishly with a riddle (14:10-14)
  - ➤ The immature use God's gifts to them as a way to brag or impress others (1 Corinthians 4:7).
- IV. Manipulated by others: Samson gives in to the pleadings of his disloyal wife (14:15-18)
  - ➤ Immature choices lead to unintended consequences (Judges 14:17; 15: 6; Proverbs 14:12).
- V. Retaliating in anger: Samson retaliates violently against the Philistines (14:19-15:8).
  - ➤ God accomplishes His purposes in spite of the immature actions of His people (Genesis 50:20).
