SERMON OUTLINE

The Son who is God Mark 12:35-37

- Jesus is Man The Messiah is the human descendant of David (Mark 12:35).
 - While teaching in the temple, Jesus asks the Jews to confirm that the Messiah ("Christ") would be David's son.
- II. <u>Jesus is God</u> The Messiah is David's "Lord." (Mark 12:36-37; Psalm 110:1).
 - A. <u>The Message of Psalm 110</u>: God will defeat Satan, sin and judge all sinners (Colossians 2:15).
 - B. The Logic of Jesus in Psalm 110:1 & Mark 12:36-37:
 - 1. Premise: The Messiah is David's Son.
 - 2. Premise: The Messiah is also David's *Lord*.
 - 3. Conclusion: Therefore Messiah is both God and Man.
 - How could the Messiah be both David's <u>Son</u> and also His <u>Lord</u> unless He was both God and man?
 - The Messiah must be humanly descended from David, yet also prove himself to be God – which describes Jesus. So Jesus is God and Man!

Why we need a Savior who is God and Man

- 1. Because Jesus is God and Man, He could pay for our sin by His death on the cross.
 - Christ "became sin" on the cross for us able to <u>die</u> because He was <u>man</u>, but able to <u>pay for sin</u> because He was <u>God</u> (2 Corinthians 5:21).
- 2. Because Jesus is God and Man, He can give us power over sin.
 - Because He is human, <u>Jesus truly understands</u> what we experience because He was tempted like we are. Because he is God, He is always <u>available to help</u> us overcome temptation (2:18; Hebrews 4:14-16).
