The Problem of Pretending

Mark 12:38-40

- I. <u>Hypocrisy is Pride</u>: The goal of the scribes was to be admired by others (Mark 12:38-39).
 - A. They dressed a certain way to appear superior.
 - B. They loved being greeted with respect.
 - C. They sought public positions of honor.

Application:

- Am I deceiving myself about my motives for appearing a certain way or having certain positions?
- II. <u>Hypocrisy is Deceit</u>: The scribes appeared spiritual publicly, but mistreated people privately (Mark 12:40a).
 - A. <u>Living in greed and dishonesty</u>: In private, the scribes did not hesitate to take financial advantage of widows.
 - B. <u>Keeping up spiritual appearances</u>: In public, the scribes prayed lengthy public prayers.

Application:

- What does God (and perhaps my family) know about me that I try to keep people from knowing?
- Do I live for what others see and think of me or what God sees and thinks (Hebrews 4:13; 1 Corinthians 4:5)?
- III. <u>Hypocrisy will be judged</u>: Jesus says that the scribes would be punished severely (Mark 12:40b).

Application:

 What might be the consequences of the pretending that I do? What should I do about it?
